



Process



- 1. Write up notes & validate transcripts
- 2. Organise comments into themes
- 3. Discuss and agree emergent themes
- 4. Develop summary statements
- 5. Discuss and agree emergent vision
- 6. Validate against literature

Quotations

Findings



- 1. Not all products have to be guidelines
- 2. Their status should be clear
- 3. Rationale linked to priorities
- 4. Development timely & transparent
- 5. Evidence-based implementation strategies
- 6. Continual programme improvement
- 7. CSP led maintenance of documents

- 1. Framework for producing material
- 2. Online central co-coordinating & mapping database
- 3. Active member promotion & engagement
- 4. Framework for all physiotherapy practice information
- 5. Active implementation programme to empower members
